Help Shut Down the Great Lakes Oil Pipeline

The Freshwater Lab is excited to host past Chairman Mike Wiggins Jr. and Aurora Conley from the Bad River Band of Lake Superior Chippewa for a panel discussion: Shutting Down the Great Lakes Pipeline.

Bad River is an **Ojibwe community** on **Lake Superior** famous for its wild rice, wetlands and sturgeonsupporting rivers. Since 2013, the tribe has been in a protracted struggle with Enbridge, a Canadian pipeline corporation, to remove a 71 year-old pipeline from the reservation and the Great Lakes watershed. **What happens at Bad River has ramifications for the entire Great Lakes region.**

Chicago is linked to the pipeline and is one of the biggest users of the oil sands that course through it. Through the event, we hope to raise awareness and engagement with the related issues. Click <u>here</u> to register.
